The seasonal influenza (flu) vaccine is available across Northern Health! This year, you can get a <u>free flu vaccine at the same appointment as your COVID-19 booter</u>. To find an influenza clinic near you, please register and book through the <u>Get Vaccinated system</u> online or by calling <u>1-833-838-2323</u> (toll free).

Overdose prevention and response

Toxic Drug Alert: Fort St John

Alert issued October 28.

There has been an increase in overdose events in the community of **Fort St John**. Reported overdoses have been associated with a white pill that is circulating and substances sold as Meth. Overdoses occurring when substances are smoked and injected.

Substances move throughout our region and may present in your community so please share this alert widely and use with caution following the harm reduction messages in the <u>printable news link</u>, and <u>toxic drug alert poster</u> (both of which include important safety information). Toxic drug alert: Prince George

Alert issued October 21, expires November 4.

There has been an increase in overdose events in the community of **Prince George**. The reported substance has tested positive for fentanyl, contains unexpected amounts of cocaine, and is described as a white pressed pill with "TEC" imprinted on it. It is being sold as Percocet in the Prince George area
