Funding opportunities

2024 PlanH Healthy Communities Grant

Deadline: July 4, 2024

The grants, administered by BC Healthy Communities, are offered across two funding streams. The Community Connectedness funding stream offers grants of up to \$5,000 each for projects that foster relationship-building among community members and create long-lasting social networks. The Healthy Public Policy stream provides grants of up to \$15,000 each for projects that seek to develop new or amend existing policies to improve the health and well-being of community members. Falls Prevention and Healthy Aging Grant (Northern Health & Pacific Public Health Foundation)

Deadline: June 30, 2024

Learn more about the new Northern Health Falls Prevention and Healthy Aging Grant and apply for up to \$10,000 for projects that support falls prevention and healthy aging efforts in your community. Local governments, Indigenous community governments, and community organizations are encouraged to apply. This grant was made possible by support from the Pacific Public Health Foundation.



Indigenous Food Security and Sovereignty Grants (New Relationship Trust) Deadline: December 1, 2024

Get your application ready for the upcoming <u>Indigenous Food Security and Sovereignty Grant</u>, which provides non-repayable funding contributions to First Nation communities, Indigenous organizations, businesses, and entrepreneurs in BC that want to develop, expand, or strengthen their Indigenous food systems.

#GreenMyCity Program (Green Cities Foundation) Deadline: Ongoing

Apply for a <u>#GreenMyCity grant</u> to support the restoration and revitalization of any publicly owned land, including parks, community gardens, sports fields, playgrounds, and public open spaces. Garden clubs, associations, neighbourhood groups, service clubs, and school/youth groups are encouraged to apply.

Northern Healthy Communities Fund (Northern Development Initiative Trust) Deadline: Ongoing

Is your community nearby an LNG Canada or Coastal GasLink project? Apply for the Northern Healthy Communities Fund to help your community adjust to the economic growth expected to occur as a result of major economic development projects.

Homelessness Community Action Grants Program (Social Planning and Research Council of BC)

Deadline: Ongoing

Learn more about the <u>Homelessness Community Action Grant Program</u> and apply for one-time funding for local planning and collaborative initiatives that better respond to the needs of those who are homeless or at risk of becoming homeless.

Secondary Suite Incentive Program (BC Housing)

Deadline: Open until funding is exhausted

Do you know any homeowners who want to help create affordable housing? The <u>Secondary Suite Incentive Program</u> provides money to help homeowners develop a new secondary suite on their property to be rented out for below market value for at least five years. Homeowners who qualify will receive up to 50% of the cost of renovations, up to a maximum of \$40,000.

Seed Funding program (Canadian Mortgage and Housing Corporation) Deadline: Ongoing

The Canada Mortgage and Housing Corporation's (CMHC) <u>Seed Funding</u> <u>Program</u> provides financial support for individuals or organizations involved in the initial phases of creating an affordable housing project. Apply for up to \$350,000 in interest-free loans.
